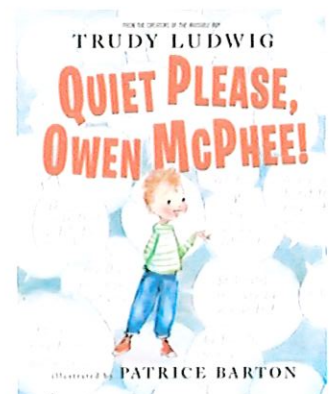
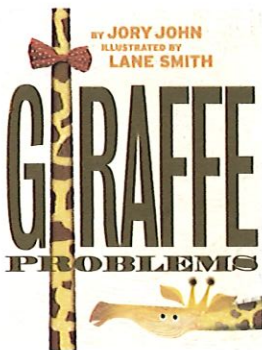
REQUIRED: CHOOSE ONE OF THE FOLLOWING BOOKS TO READ:

Paper Bag Book Report

Complete the Paper Bag Book Report about the book you chose to read.

MATERIALS:

A brown paper grocery bag or a small gift bag

Colored pencils, markers or crayons

Scotch tape or glue stick

Paper

PROJECT REQUIREMENTS:

1. On the **front** of the bag neatly include:
 - Title of the Book
 - Author of the Book
 - An illustration of your favorite part of the book
 - A caption for your illustration
2. On **one side** of the bag:
 - Draw the main character.
 - Include a caption for the main character.
3. On the **opposite side** of the bag:
 - Illustrate the setting.
 - Include a caption about the setting.
4. On the **back** of the bag:
 - Neatly write a 3-5 sentence paragraph about your favorite part of the story. The paragraph can be written on lined paper, cut out and glued or scotch-taped to the bag.
 - Also on the back, write a 3-5 sentence paragraph about your opinion of the book. Did you like it? If you did like it, tell me three reasons why. If you did not like it, tell three reasons why you didn't. You can also describe who might enjoy reading the book.
5. Collect at least **2 or three things (that will fit into your bag)** to help you tell the class about your book when you present your report to the class.

Parents are encouraged to help their child keep a record of their summer reading. A Summer Reading Log is available on the next page. Please print the log and list the books by writing the title, author, and genre. Students should bring their list on the first day of school and will be recognized for their summer reading accountability.
