Students in 2nd, 4th, and MS/HS Visual Art need a sketchbook for Art class starting on Monday.

Our littlest scorpions started the year off with lines and shapes. The PK3 students went fishing, chasing characters from Finding Dory as they swam in curly, wavy, and straight lines. JK students went a step further, using lines to make shapes. They then used the shapes to draw a crayon. After the Labor Day weekend, the PK3 students will begin making alphabet art, and our JK artists will explore through literacy.

The 2nd Grade artists are studying cityscapes, beginning with geometric cut-paper castles, inspired by artist Paul Klee's, *Castle in the Sun*.

4th Grade is beginning their Still Life studies. This week they reviewed Elements of Art that they will need to create a series of drawings. Keep an eye out for some PEAR-fic drawings!

Finally, our Middle & High School students are being challenged this week to find Elements and Principles of Art in images. Students are creating slideshows of art and brief descriptions of why the work was selected to represent the Element/ Principle. This activity is preparing our students as they enter the IB program in the future, as they will be required to complete a comparative study, describing and analyzing 2-3 works of art in relationship to each other. This activity also encourages them to explore new artists/styles to enhance their own work.
