

From the Head of School October 23, 2020

Dear Colleagues, Parents, Students, and Friends,

At Brandon Academy, our goal is for all of our students to have an opportunity to pursue rigorous and engaging courses that will prepare them for college and/or a career of their choice. This week, I informed the upper school faculty and students that, next year, we will be transitioning away from the IB program and implementing a new Advanced Placement (AP) curriculum. AP courses are college-level courses offered in high school, and AP courses reflect what is taught in top introductory college courses. Students take AP exams in May, measuring their mastery of college-level work on a 1-5 point scale. A score of 3 or higher on an AP exam can typically earn students college credit and/or placement into advanced courses in college. All Florida state universities MUST offer college credit for a 3 or higher on an AP exam. Here is a link to information about AP credit at thousands of colleges and universities. Think of the IB program as a one size fits all kind of program, while the AP program is more tailored to each student.

Our teachers, students, and administration are very excited about the greater flexibility in scheduling AP courses will provide, meaning students will have more access to elective courses. AP courses also allow students to focus on areas of strength or passion, therefore helping students during the college admissions process. Students will have far more opportunities to earn college credit. Starting in 9th grade, students will be able to take AP courses. Finally, because AP is run by the same company that administers the PSAT and SAT tests, our new curriculum will develop a better foundation for success on the SAT/ ACT exams.

This switch in curriculum is part of a bigger picture plan to enhance the high school experience for our students. I welcome any BA parent to attend my coffee conversation via Zoom next Thursday, October 29 at 8:30 am to find out more information. Details are below.

Personally, I have had the privilege of sending my three boys to four private schools. As a parent and educator, I have seen and learned a lot. The most common mistake made by parents is they think the "grass is greener" at another school. Having spent 13 years leading large, college preparatory schools in Naples, FL and Wilmington, NC, I learned that the most important factor in navigating high school successfully was <u>relationships</u>.

When a student enters 9th grade, their college resume is blank, like a white piece of paper, and over the course of four years, students will paint a picture of themselves for colleges through their academic studies, the clubs they join, their leadership skills, the sports they play, and the community service they perform. Some pictures are more defined than others, and that is usually because a teacher, coach, or college counselor helped guide them along the way.

Colleges and universities are looking to build diverse classes, and they do not compare BA high school students with students from other high schools because every school does things differently. They look at whether or not a child took advantage of the opportunities that the school provided them and how successful they were.


In Wilmington, parents thought that CFA was too small, so they sent their child to a larger, more expensive private school. At the end of the day, CFA students were much happier during high school because they were not in a "pressure cooker" school, and the college placements were just as impressive because of the guidance students received from teachers, coaches, and the college counselors. Many parents did not consider that universities do not want a large number of incoming freshmen from the same high school. Again, they look for diversity. They need business majors, science majors, artists, education majors, and student-athletes.

The curriculum changes in the high school will enhance the middle and lower school curriculums, and we are very excited about the potential these changes will have on your sons and daughters. I hope you will join me next Thursday.

Scholarship Opportunities

The scholarships listed below do not encompass all available scholarships —they are merely a comprehensive list of every scholarship of which we have been made aware. Please note: for any scholarship where counselors need to complete a recommendation form or letter, we ask for three weeks' notification to allow us ample time to complete the recommendation.

Practice for the SAT Opportunity Scholarship

Seniors who spend at least 6 hours prepping for the SAT with Khan Academy are qualified to win one of 150 \$1,000 scholarships. Students can increase their chance of winning by practicing more hours. **Deadline is October 31, 2020.**

Coca-Cola Scholars Program

Seniors are eligible to apply. This is an achievement-based scholarship recognizing students for the capacity to lead and serve, as well as their commitment to making a significant impact on their schools and communities. 150 students are selected each year to receive a \$25,000 scholarship. **Deadline is October 31, 2020.**

Middle District of Florida 2020 High School Essay Contest

High school students living in Hillsborough, Pasco, & Pinellas County are invited to submit an essay celebrating the 100th anniversary of the 19th Amendment. Awards ranging from \$50 - \$2,000 will be given to students at a special awards ceremony. Submissions must not exceed 1,000 words. Deadline is noon on November 2, 2020.

Brooks Law Group Community Scholarship

Seniors who complete a 700 - 1,400-word essay on the assigned topic are eligible. Two scholarships will be awarded: first place winner will receive \$1,000 & second place winner will receive \$250. Essays are due by November 6.

Prudential Spirit of Community Awards

High School students who have engaged in volunteer activity within the past 12 months are eligible to apply. Awards range from \$1,000 - \$5,000. **Deadline is November 10, 2020.**

Elks Lodge "Most Valuable Student" Scholarship

Seniors who are planning on pursuing a four-year degree on a full-time basis are eligible to apply. Applicants do not need to be related to a member of the Elks. **Deadline is November 15, 2020.**

National Honor Society Scholarship

Seniors who are active members of NHS are eligible to apply. Awards range from \$3,200 - \$25,000. **Deadline is December 1, 2020.**

Profile in Courage Essay Contest

Students in all grade levels are eligible to apply. Essay should be 700 - 1,000 words describing an act of political courage by a US elected official who served during or after 1917. The official may have addressed an issue at the local, state, or national level. Essays must have a minimum of 5 sources. **Deadline is January 15, 2021.**
