It has been a long standing tradition for BA students to wear appropriate costumes to school for Halloween. This year, it is our intention to maintain the positive and fun spirit of this event. While students are not required to wear costumes on Halloween, those students who do wish to participate are reminded of the following guidelines:

- 1. Face painting should be applied at home and should be minimally applied so that students' faces are recognizable. Students will still need to wear their cloth face mask.
- 2. Costumes may not mock another student, faculty member, race, religious or lifestyle preference.
- 3. Costume accessories that are deemed dangerous or similar to weaponry are not permitted.
- 4. Do not wear masks or any item that will impede your vision or identity.
- 5. Finally, all costumes should maintain the integrity of our school dress code.

Please understand that these guidelines are put in place to ensure the safety of all our students. Wearing a costume is considered a school privilege. Students are allowed to wear their costumes during the course of the day.

Each year, our students display some of the most well designed costumes that require a lot of thought and planning. This year should be no different. I look forward to seeing the creativity of our students when they arrive at school on October 30th.



While many families are trying to figure out how to celebrate Halloween during COVID, we are pleased to announce that BA will have a Trunk or Treat for students in grades JK through 3rd grade at 8:45 am on Friday, October 30. We are limiting the number of cars to 30. Parents that want to participate need to <u>sign-up here</u>. Here are the details:

Controlling the Crowd for Trunk or Treat

Lower School students will parade 6 feet apart and this will also be the case for the Trunk

or Treat. Families that participate will have to stay 6 feet back from the students. The school will be using white lines to mark the 6 feet buffer along the parade route. BA will also mark the parking spaces with large Xs to make sure cars are appropriately distanced. Finally, arrows and SGA students will help to direct foot traffic and keep students walking in one direction.

Mask Up for Trunk or Treat

The tradition of dressing in costume on Halloween originated from ancient traditions of warding off spirits. It will be mandatory that everyone mask up at Trunk or Treat to ward off COVID-19. Here are some halloween themed masks:

Trunk or Treat Candy

We will be skipping the bowl of treats to pass out this year so the trick or treaters aren't all reaching into the same bowl. Instead, each Trunk or Treat car should have a table set up six feet in front of it. Pre packaged snacks, candy, or treat bags should be laid out on the table for kids to pick up. McDonald's usually sells Halloween Treat Packs that cost \$1, which includes coupons for free ice cream cones, burgers, and apple slices—a fun treat to redeem later!
