The IB Website

Established in 1968, the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme (DP) was the first programme offered by the IB and is taught to students aged 16-19. As of September 2019, there were 3,421 schools offering the DP, in 157 different countries worldwide.

The IB Curriculum

The International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme (DP) curriculum sets out the requirements for study of the DP. The curriculum is made up of the DP core and six subject groups. The six subject groups are:

- <u>Studies in language and literature</u>
- <u>Language acquisition</u>
- Individuals and societies
- <u>Sciences</u>
- <u>Mathematics</u>
- <u>The arts</u>

There are different courses within each subject group.

The IB Core Elements

Made up of the three required components, the DP core aims to broaden students' educational experience and challenge them to apply their knowledge and skills. The three core elements are:

- <u>Theory of knowledge</u>, in which students reflect on the nature of knowledge and on how we know what we claim to know.
- <u>The extended essay</u>, which is an independent, self-directed piece of research, finishing with a 4,000-word paper.
- <u>Creativity, activity, service</u>, in which students complete a project related to those three concepts.

Honor Code and Responsible Use

The Brandon Academy Honor Code and Responsible Use Plan apply to the Distance Learning plan.

Masks

BA will require all teachers and students to wear cloth face coverings throughout the day, except during lunch or during outdoor activities when students are well dispersed. Cloth face coverings are meant to protect other people in case the wearer is unknowingly infected but does not have symptoms. Cloth face coverings are not surgical masks, respirators, or other medical personal protective equipment. Face coverings should be worn by staff and students, and are most essential in times when physical distancing is difficult. We will remind each other frequently not to touch the face covering and to wash our hands. **Parents should purchase five (5) cloth face coverings for each child attending BA**.

Cloth face coverings will **NOT** be placed on:

- Anyone who has trouble breathing or is unconscious.
- Anyone who is incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the face covering without assistance.
- Anyone who cannot tolerate a cloth face covering due to developmental, medical or behavioral health needs.

Face coverings for Pre-K students

- Children 5 years of age and under are not required to wear a face shield or face covering in a child care setting.
- Children who are under the age of 2 years, or children who are sleeping, unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a face covering or face shield without assistance; or who cannot tolerate a shield or covering due to a developmental, medical, or behavioral health condition must not wear a face covering or face shield.
- Children age 2 through 5 years who can reliably wear a face covering or face shield in compliance with CDC guidance on <u>How to Wear Cloth Face</u> <u>Coverings</u> may do so. This means they can wear it without frequently touching or removing it.

Families can find more information on the proper use, wearing, removal, and cleaning of cloth face coverings, such as <u>CDC's Guidance on wearing and</u> removing cloth face masks and CDC's use of cloth masks.

Online Classes- Behavior & Etiquette

Students should follow the handbook with regards to dress code and discipline expectations. Students will be required to use mute during parts of a lesson or the "raise hand" feature of Zoom. Students will follow expectations communicated by teachers, including not using cell phones during classes.

Parents/Caregivers

Brandon Academy understands that a shift to a distance learning approach will require our students and families to make adjustments. Yet a continued partnership with parents and guardians can play a vital part of ensuring the success of the plan. Division Directors, learning support staff, the technology department, and teachers are all available to support and guide students (and parents/guardians/caregivers) should they need help. Below are some guidelines for parents/guardians/caregivers to help students achieve success with distance learning. Overall, we encourage you to embrace this time at home as a new adventure with great possibilities.
