2020-2021 Handbook Modification



The exponential growth of technology and its role in education for students has been very exciting, but has also proven to be very challenging. Students are faced with more distractions than ever before, and many students are struggling to maintain focus and concentration, manage impulsivity, and avoid distraction. General research shows that when students carry phones with them or wear a smartwatch, they display lower levels of concentration due to constant interruptions, an increased fear of missing out, reduced memory, warped views on reality, and increased levels of stress. Most recent research has found that the mere presence of a phone or smartwatch, either in a pocket or on a desk, is enough to reduce cognitive capacity. In order to support students' learning and positive well-being, effective Tuesday, September 7, students will not be permitted to wear smartwatches in class. Unlike iPads and laptops, students are not required to have a smartwatch in school. Students are permitted to keep their smartwatch in their backpacks. If, in an emergency, a student needs to contact a parent or a parent needs to contact his/her child during the school day, this contact would be made via the BA Main Office.
