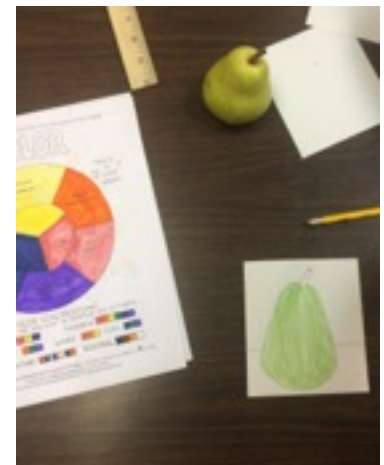
Lastly, our Yearbook class continues to capture a day in the life at Brandon Academy as they further grow their photography skills.

4th Grade will be studying still-life art throughout the year. They are learning how to show 3D objects on a 2D surface using value (shading), proportion, and overlapping. They began their value studies with pears and have now transitioned into a large fall-themed still life. In their pear studies, they had to draw one realistic, one black & white, one contour (outline), and one using a color scheme (an organized group of colors) of their choice.

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
